

MINUTES OF THE MEETING
OF
SANITARY AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 7
OF
PLATTE COUNTY, NEBRASKA

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska, was convened in accordance with Executive Order No. 20-03 at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday, September 16, 2025, at the Columbus Housing Authority-Community Room, 2554 40th Avenue, Columbus, Nebraska. Trustees present at the meeting were: Jerome Slusarski, Doug Brackhan, Jim Peterson, Reed Grandgenett, and Kevin McCright. Trustees Absent: none. Other interested parties present: Reed Grandgenett, new Trustee; Jenny Reppert, Platte County Treasurer; Adam Elm and Macklin Schwartz, Accountants for Smejkal & Elm, P.C.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the *Columbus Telegram* on September 12, 2025, a copy of the Proof of Publication being attached to these minutes. The availability of the Agenda was communicated in the published notice and in the Notice to the Trustees of this meeting. All of the subjects addressed at this meeting were contained in the Agenda for at least 24 hours prior to the meeting, which Agenda was kept continually current and readily available for public inspection at the offices of Smejkal & Elm P.C., 3403 27th Street, Columbus, Nebraska.. All proceedings of the Board were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public. A current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available and accessible to members of the public, posted during the meeting in the meeting area and all in attendance at the meeting were informed of the location of such copy. At least one copy of all resolutions and other reproducible written materials, for which actions are shown in said proceedings, was made available for examination and copying by members of the public at the meeting.

The undersigned Clerk hereby certifies that these minutes were written and available for public inspection within ten (10) working days after the date of said meeting.

Following roll call, the Chairman directed the Board's attention to Item No. 1 on the agenda, pertaining to the public hearing on the proposed budget and adoption thereof. The Chairman declared the hearing open to the public at 8:30 a.m. Appearances for the purpose of the hearing were those persons listed as present at the beginning of these minutes. The Trustees discussed the budget as published.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 2 on the agenda. The discussion covered the topics required by LB 148. There being no further discussion pertaining to the proposed 2025-2026 budget, the budget hearing closed at 9:15 a.m. Moved by Trustee McCright and seconded by Trustee Slusarski.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 3 on the agenda, pertaining to the hearing on the property tax request of the District for the 2025-2026 fiscal year based upon the proposed budget. The Chairman declared the hearing open to the public at 9:16 a.m. Appearances for the purpose of the property tax request were those persons listed as present at the beginning of these minutes. The Trustees discussed the tax request as published.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 4 on the agenda. There being no further discussion pertaining to the 2025-2026 property tax request, the special hearing closed at 9:17 a.m. Moved by trustee Brackhan and seconded by Trustee Peterson.

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The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 5 on the agenda. The Chairman called the regular meeting of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska to order and open for public comment at 9:18 a.m.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 6 on the agenda, pertaining to discussion and approval of the April 16, 2025 meeting minutes. After a full discussion, the following resolution was moved by Trustee Peterson and seconded by Trustee Grandgenett, to-wit:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska approve the April 16, 2025 meeting minutes.

On roll call for the foregoing resolution, the following Trustees voted Aye: Brackhan, Peterson, Slusarski, McCright, and Grandgenett. Voting Nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution was duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 7 on the agenda, pertaining to discussion and financial review of the District's accounts. Discussion was held regarding this item. No action was taken at this time.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 8 on the agenda, pertaining to the approval and adoption of the proposed 2025-2026 budget. After full discussion, the following resolution was moved by Trustee McCright and seconded by Trustee Grandgenett, to-wit:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska approve and adopt the proposed 2025-2026 budget as presented.

On roll call for the foregoing resolution, the following Trustees voted Aye: Brackhan, Peterson, Slusarski, McCright, and Grandgenett. Voting Nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution was duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 9 on the agenda, pertaining to approval of the District's 2025-2026 property tax request. After a full discussion, the following resolution was moved by Trustee Peterson and seconded by Trustee Grandgenett, to wit:

WHEREAS, Nebraska Revised Statute 77-1632 provides that the Governing Body of the Sanitary and Improvement District #7 in Platte County passes by a majority vote a resolution or ordinance setting the tax request; and

WHEREAS, a special public hearing was held as required by law to hear and consider comments concerning the property tax request; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the Governing Body of Trustees of the Sanitary and Improvement District #7 in Platte County, Nebraska, by a majority vote, resolves that:

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a) The 2024-2025 property tax request be set at:

General Fund	\$ 33,461.50
Sewer Force Main Replacement Fund	<u>50,000.00</u>
Total Tax Request	<u>\$ 83,461.50</u>

- b) The total assessed value of property differs from last year's total assessed value by -3.74%.
- c) The tax rate which would levy the same amount of property taxes as last year, when multiplied by the new total assessed value of property, would be \$0.13343 per \$100 of assessed value.
- d) The Sanitary and Improvement District #7 in Platte County, Nebraska proposes to adopt a property tax request that will cause its tax rate to be \$0.128446 per \$100 of assessed value.
- e) Based on the proposed property tax request and changes in other revenue, the total operating budget of Sanitary and Improvement District #7 in Platte County, Nebraska increased by 19.3%.
- f) A copy of this resolution be certified and forwarded to the County Clerk on or before October 15, 2025.

On roll call for the foregoing resolution, the following Trustees voted Aye: Brackhan, Peterson, Slusarski, McCright, and Grandgenett. Voting Nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution was duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 10 on the agenda, pertaining to discussion and approval of an additional 1% increase in restricted funds authority. After full discussion, the following resolution was moved by Trustee Slusarski and seconded by Trustee McCright, to-wit:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska will approve an additional 1% increase in restricted funds authority.

On roll call for the foregoing resolution, the following Trustees voted Aye: Brackhan, Peterson, Slusarski, McCright, and Grandgenett. Voting Nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution was duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 12 on the agenda, pertaining to discussion and approval of using the adopted 2025-2026 budget as the audit waiver. After full discussion, the following resolution was moved by Trustee McCright and seconded by Trustee Slusarski, to-wit:

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BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska approve the use of the adopted 2025-2026 budget as the District's audit waiver.

On roll call for the foregoing resolution, the following Trustees voted Aye: Brackhan, Peterson, Slusarski, McCright, and Grandgenett. Voting Nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution was duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 12 on the agenda, pertaining to payment of outstanding bills on file and bills presented during the meeting. After a full discussion, the following resolution was moved by Trustee Slusarski and seconded by Grandgenett McCright, to-wit:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska, that the Chairman and Clerk be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to execute and deliver **General Fund** Warrant Nos. 856 dated today's date, to the following payees and in the following amounts:

- A. General Fund Warrant No. 856 in the sum of Sixteen and 00/100's Dollars (\$16.00), payable to Platte County Register of Deeds for filing Statement Pursuant.

On roll call for the foregoing resolution, the following Trustees voted Aye: Brackhan, Slusarski, Peterson, McCright, and Grandgenett. Voting Nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution was duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 13 on the agenda, pertaining to the review of existing preapproved spending accounts. After a full discussion, the following resolution was moved by Trustee McCright and seconded by Trustee Petereson, to-wit:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska pre-approve payments up to Three Hundred Fifty and 00/100's Dollars (\$350.00), payable to Loup Power District for utility services.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska pre-approve payments up to Two Hundred and 00/100's Dollars (\$200.00) for the levee maintenance materials.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska pre-approve payments up to Two Thousand and 00/100's Dollars (\$2,000.00) for mowing services.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska pre-approve payments up to Four Thousand and 00/100's Dollars (\$4,000.00) for CPA services.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska pre-approve payments up to One Thousand Five Hundred and 00/100's Dollars (\$1,500.00) for fencing off the pasture.

The pre-approved accounts for the expanding south gate were closed.

On roll call for the foregoing resolutions, the following Trustees voted Aye: Brackhan, Peterson, McCright, Grandgenett, and Slusarski. Voting Nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolutions were duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 14 on the agenda, pertaining to the approval of Johnson Trucking for snow removal. After a full discussion, the following resolution was moved by Trustee Slusarski and seconded by Trustee McCright, to-wit:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska approved Johnson Trucking for snow removal.

On roll call for the foregoing resolution, the following Trustees voted Aye: Brackhan, Slusarski, Peterson, McCright, and Grandgenett. Voting Nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution were duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 15 on the agenda, pertaining to the discussion and approval of the NDEQ December payment. After a full discussion, the following resolution was moved by Trustee McCright and seconded by Trustee Slusarski, to-wit:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska, that the Chairman and Clerk be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to execute and deliver **Sewer Force Main Replacement Fund** Warrant No. 73 in the sum of Twenty-Three Thousand Five Hundred Seventy four and 73/100's Dollars (\$23,574.73), payable to Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality for payment of semi-annual interest and principal payment on loan #C317980 due December 15, 2025.

On roll call for the foregoing resolution, the following Trustees voted Aye: Brackhan, Kosch, Slusarski, McCright, and Grandgenett. Voting Nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution were duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 16 on the agenda, pertaining to the reviewing the LARM insurance to update to add new generator to the contract. After a full discussion, the following resolution was moved by Trustee Kosch and seconded by Trustee Slusarski, to-wit:

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BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 7 of Platte County, Nebraska approved of the renewal for three years and adding the generator to the policy.

On roll call for the foregoing resolutions, the following Trustees voted Aye: Brackhan, Peterson, McCright, Grandgenett, and Slusarski. Voting Nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolutions were duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 17 on the agenda, pertaining to finding an app for emergency communications for residents. Trustee Grandgenett recommended using the Remind App which is free. They will use the Remind App.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 18 on the agenda, pertaining to finding a vendor to install a gate expansion in the lift station fence. The project is complete and the preapproved account can be closed.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to item No. 19 on the agenda, pertaining to reviewing the needs to make the drain tube functional. BD Construction will be consulted for this project.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to item No. 20 on the agenda, pertaining to checking with the fire department if they will use the dry fire hydrant. Tabled until next meeting.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to item No. 21 on the agenda, pertaining to updating the flood gate training files. Discussed grinding a drain groove by the flood walls. Trustee Brackhan is updating the training files. Grinding a drain groove was tabled for the time being.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to item No. 22 on the agenda, pertaining to getting quotes on an emergency generator. A generator was selected and is on order for November delivery.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to item No. 23 on the agenda, pertaining to scheduling levee inspection, storm drain cleaning and exercising the sewer line shut off valves. Discussion was held regarding this item. Inspection will be scheduled in late fall.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to item No. 24 on the agenda, pertaining to erecting the street sign that got knocked down. This has been completed.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to item No. 25 on the agenda, pertaining to reviewing the project to resurface the top of the southeast section of the levee. BD Construction will be asked to update their quote for next summer.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to item No. 26 on the agenda, pertaining to discussing the need for mowing, reseeding, fertilizing, street sweeping and spraying. Reed will survey Whitetail residents for their inputs about mowing at the lake association meeting.

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The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Item No. 27 on the agenda, pertaining to miscellaneous comments. Discussed making additional NDEQ loan payments but has been tabled for a future meeting. Also discussed and ice jam meeting in October, gap at boat ramp and the need to clean rocks and dirt from street by the lift station for street cleaner.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, a motion for adjournment was duly moved by Trustee Slusarski and seconded by Trustee Peterson, and unanimously carried. The meeting was adjourned at 10:30 a.m.




